This doesn't just have to be; we must and can change to what we need and deserve. I have continued to work hard to improve Hawaii's economy, jobs and family incomes while also reducing costs. I have worked with this administration and Congressional majority where I can, such as to counter China. But I have largely opposed what I believe are the wrong policies for our country both overseas and at home as well as the undermining of our democratic foundations. ## 2025 HIGHLIGHTS

Here are a few sample highlights of my 2025 activities (for full record, please see [case.house.gov](https://case.house.gov)):

### JANUARY

Sworn into the 119th Congress (2025-27); joined President's presentation of Medal of Honor posthumously to Army PVT Bruno R. Orig of Honolulu; first of regular meetings with Governor Green; returned as Vice Chair of bipartisan Problem Solvers Caucus and member of Sustainable Energy and Environment Caucus; hosted six in-person Talk Story community meetings across district; reintroduced Sustainable Budget Act to stabilize federal deficit/debt.

### FEBRUARY

Co-founded House Litigation Working Group to oppose Trump policies in courts; first districtwide Tele-Talk Story; introduced three Jones Act reform measures to reduce cost of living; conducted annual Labor Roundtable with unions; introduced deep seabed mining halt; conducted annual federal funding/appropriations workshop at State Capitol.

### MARCH

Began seven months of Appropriations Committee meetings on Fiscal Year 2026 funding; visited Lahaina again to review federal wildfire recovery funding; regular Hawai'i delegation meeting with Sens. Schatz and Hirono and Rep. Tokuda; joined 50th anniversary celebration of Polynesian Voyaging Society/Hōkūle'a; demanded that Army restore 100th/442nd special recognition website; again reintroduced ERA ratification resolution and PRO (Protecting Right to Organize) Act.

### APRIL

Appropriations-Defense delegation to the Philippines, Guam and Hawai'i; met in DC with Hawai'i State Teachers Assn and Hawai'i Building and Construction Trades Council; first of three full-week Walk Stories (walking and talking with constituents) throughout my district; met with Navy Closure Task Force and Ernie Lau/Board of Water Supply to assure Red Hill closure funded and on track; again reintroduced the Equality Act (federal LGBTQ+ civil rights protections).

### MAY

Received the 2025 Former Members of Congress Statesmanship Award; met with UH President Wendy Hensel on federal funding and issues; introduced Pacific Partnership Act with fellow Pacific Islands Caucus co-chairs/members; joined Memorial Day at Punchbowl.

### JUNE

Secured \$1 million in Appropriations for new Honolulu Police Dept. mobile command center; urged Japan to end domestic ivory trade to save elephants; secured Appropriations approval of amendment to prevent transmission of classified information over unsecured networks; met with Hawai'i Christian Coalition on mutual goals; joined Palarong Pinoy at the Fil-Com Center in Waipahu; again cosponsored the American Dream and Promise Act.

### JULY

Voted against the reconciliation budget measure; met with Hawai'i Attorney General Lopez on legal response to administration actions; joined premiere of Chiefs of War at Ko Olina and Puerto Rican Festival at Mililani; signed discharge petition to force House vote on Ukraine Support Act.

### AUGUST

Spoke on saving Social Security and Medicare at AARP-Hawai'i annual convention; joined Pearl Harbor Naval Shipyard apprentice graduation; celebrated Obon at Waipahu Soto Zen Temple Taiyoji; reintroduced four bills to expand Voting Rights Act of '65 protections.

### SEPTEMBER

Signed discharge petition forcing a House vote on releasing the Epstein files; testified before the Hawai'i State Senate Judiciary Committee on the Trump administration's policies eroding the rule of law; helped constituent secure initial retirement benefits while final annuity calculated; completed twelve Appropriations measures with billions to Hawai'i.

### OCTOBER

Focused in DC and Hawai'i on ending the federal shutdown and assisting affected constituents; conducted second districtwide Tele-Talk Story; spoke at the 175th anniversary of the Chamber of Commerce of Hawai'i; partnered with Rep. Tokuda at The Pantry food distribution in Kalihi.

### NOVEMBER

Continued full focus in DC and Hawai'i on ending the federal shutdown and assisting constituents; hosted a Veterans Talk Story at the O'ahu Veterans Center in Foster Village; another meeting with Mayor Blangiardi to stay aligned on federal-DC issues; joined Sen. Schatz on a measure to preserve indigenous peoples' histories and cultures; sent districtwide Kūpuna Report.

### DECEMBER

Sent 12th districtwide e-newsletter of the year, focusing on reducing the cost of living; worked with bipartisan group to solve Affordable Care Act health insurance crisis for some 24,000 local residents as reported by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services; nominated 30 promising high school seniors to our nation's service academies; sent Mele Kalikimaka/Mahalo video message to armed forces serving away from home.
