Dear Administrator Zeldin:

We write with deep concern regarding the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) recent decision to move to vacate its determinations and enforceable drinking water standards for four per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS)—hexafluoropropylene oxide dimer acid (GenX), perfluorohexane sulfonic acid (PFHxS), perfluoronanoic acid (PFNA),¹ and its plans to delay compliance with the standards for two additional PFAS, perfluorooctanoic acid (PFOA) and perfluorooctanesulfonic acid (PFOS).² PFAS, more commonly known as 'forever chemicals,' resist breaking down in the environment and accumulate in the human body, leading to increased health risks over a lifetime. Children, pregnant women, and communities already burdened by pollution are especially vulnerable to the harms of PFAS exposure, including developmental delays, hormonal disruption, and elevated risks of cancer.³

Your actions to roll back protections for GenX, PFHxS, PFNA, and PFBS, and to delay compliance with standards for PFOA and PFOS represent a serious abdication of the EPA's duty to safeguard public health. If the EPA continues down this road, these decisions to allow forever chemicals into our water supplies will undermine years of work to protect Americans from toxic PFAS and disproportionately harm our nation's most vulnerable communities.

The EPA's April 2024 rule was a long-overdue step forward after decades of advocacy by impacted communities, scientists, and public health experts.⁴ This rule created the first nationwide, legally enforceable drinking water standard to help prevent exposure to PFAS chemicals, setting health-protective limits for six PFAS chemicals and requiring public reporting so families can know if their water is safe.⁵ These protections were celebrated by people across the country, especially parents who have long worried about what was coming out of their taps and what it means for their children's future.

Your recent motion to vacate the standards and regulatory determinations for PFNA, PFBS, PFHxS, and GenX is a devastating reversal for the millions of people who rely on these protections for their health and safety. Nearly 200 million Americans have PFAS in their drinking water, causing them to face higher rates of illness and endure the constant fear that a simple glass of water could harm their health. For parents of young children, every delay in action is another day of exposure during the most critical stages of growth and development. Underserved communities, which already face disproportionate environmental and health burdens, will bear the brunt of this dangerous rollback.

EPA is taking steps to reduce protections against these 'forever chemicals', despite the *Safe Drinking Water Act's* clear anti-backsliding provision that prohibits the EPA from weakening drinking water standards once they are set.⁷ Your motion circumvents this important safeguard, raising serious questions about the agency's commitment to its mission of protecting human health and the environment. We urge you to immediately reverse course, defend the 2024 PFAS drinking water standards, and prioritize swift implementation. The EPA's responsibility is to the American people.

We ask that the EPA provide a clear, written commitment to:

- 1. Uphold and fully enforce the nation's PFAS drinking water standards without weakening or delaying protections.
- 2. Center the health of vulnerable populations—particularly children, pregnant women, and low-income communities—in all PFAS-related decisions and public communications.
- 3. Work transparently with Congress, states, and impacted communities to accelerate progress on PFAS monitoring, treatment, and long-term exposure prevention.
- 4. Send a report to Congress on the expected health effects of delaying compliance with PFOA and PFOS standards, especially for vulnerable groups like children and pregnant women.

Safe drinking water is not a privilege; it is a basic human right. Every day without robust, science-backed regulations means communities across the nation being exposed to more PFAS, increasing long-term health risks. The people who elected us deserve decisive action that puts their health first. We look forward to your response before November 28th.
